California Native Plant Garden Tour

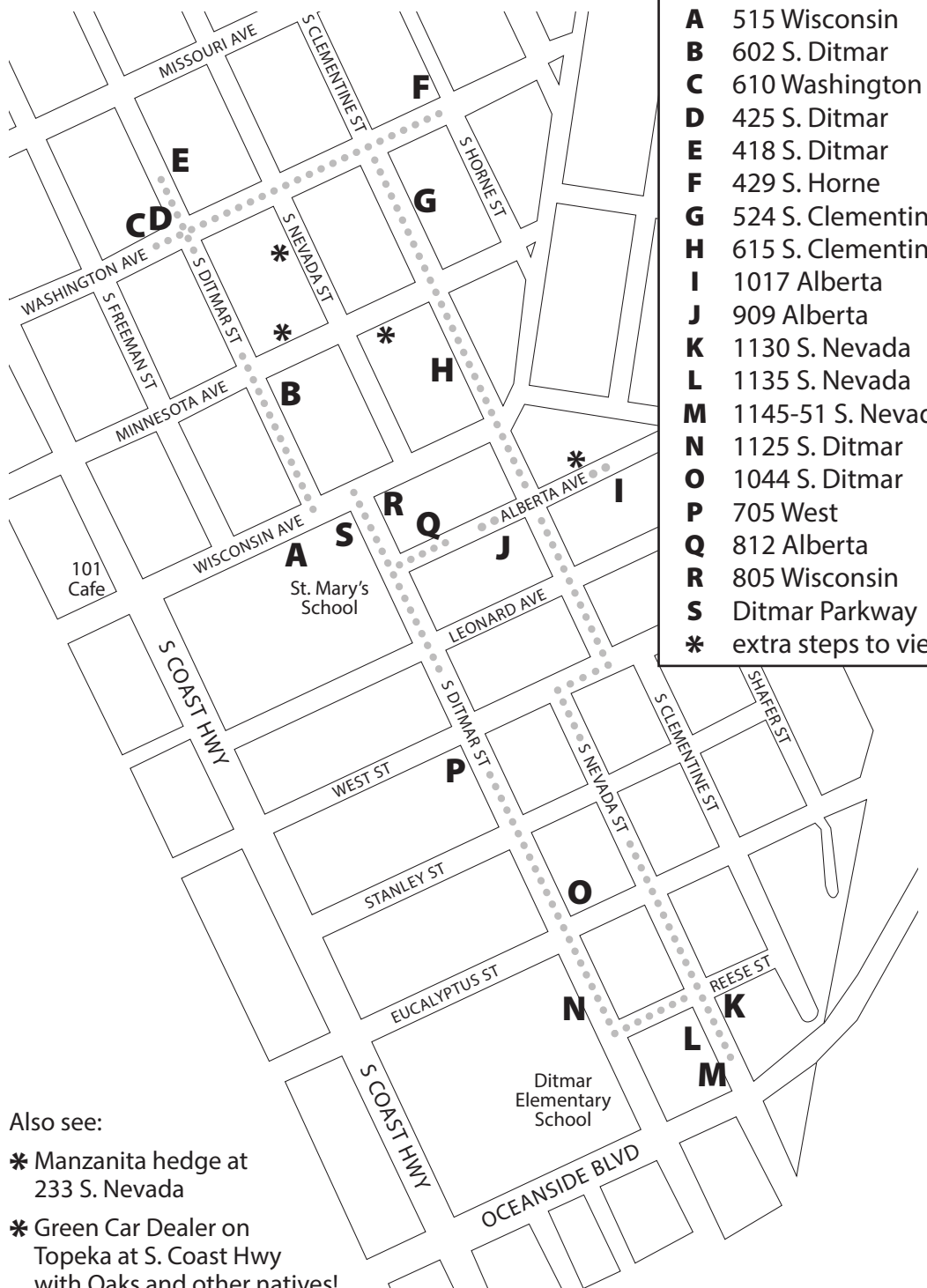


Welcome!

Native plants have evolved here and were not introduced by man. When a plant has been introduced within the past few hundred years, the necessary adaptations haven't had time to occur. Often native species are lost as a new plant takes over. Pampas grass is an example of an introduced plant. It does not provide food or shelter and has destroyed native areas. By choosing native species for our gardens, we're reducing demand for this and other detrimental invaders, and helping to keep alive our region's glorious botanical heritage.
